John Hogan, a fine lad, 14 years, died yesterday morning, near Groody, of hydrophobia, after suffering torments the most excruciating for three days before, all the symptoms of this incurable malady having been distinctly marked on the unfortunate victim, as the paroxysms rapidly succeeded each other. There was cold, clammy perspiration, fearful shrieks, and a horror of drink, the very sight of which caused convulsions; burying his head in the bed-clothes, and threatening suffocation, in the effort to swallow the least liquid, though panting for moisture to cool his lips, upon which a frothy mucus gathered, while the teeth were set close in spasmodic action. Nature sunk at last under the violent struggle, and the poor lad died a sad spectacle to his miserable relatives, who vainly laboured to sustain him. He was bitten by a dog about three weeks ago; and it would be a mercy to the public if the police would shoot only half these dangerous animals, which infest the streets and roadways.

At the City Police office yesterday, Robert M'Mason, E.q., J.P., was the only magistrate on the the Bench. Michael Murphy was charged with assaulting his wife and threatening to take her life, and to wring the head off one of his children. Head Constable Joynt said that the prisoner, when drunk, was a most violent character. The wife, a very decent looking woman, with some reluctance made her informations to the effect, that she stood in fear and terror of her life, from the violent conduct of the prisoner towards her and her children, all owing to the effects of drink. The prisoner was ordered to find security to keep the peace, himself in £5 and two sureties in £2 10s. each, or be imprisoned for a month. Bridget Madigan, Bridget Madden, Honora Cussen, and Mary White, annoying the streets at 12 o'clock the previous night—fined 1s. each and costs, or twenty-four hours. Phil Ryan, a corn broker from Pennywell, alias "Ryan bull," was fined 5s. and costs for being drunk and disorderly in Denmark-street.

At the City Police Court this day before Alderman Watson, John Kennedy of Castle-Connell was fined 5s. and costs for being drunk and disorderly in the streets. Honor Kennedy stealing cabbage out of a garden, 14 days imprisonment. A man named Thos. Burns was brought up in custody of a Railway Policeman who stated that Mr. Sidley had given the prisoner in charge to him this morning for being riotous and assaulting him in the carriage. Mr. Sidley did not appear, and the prisoner who was very drunk and insolent on the table was fined 5s. and cost or 48 hours for being drunk in court, and the other charge against him was dismissed as Mr. Sidley did not appear.
