**DEATHS.**

On Wednesday night last, at his father's house, George's-  
 street, after a short illness, of cerebral paralysis, in the 25th  
 year of his age; Michael, the only and beloved son of Michael  
 Min, Esq. late Mayor of Limerick. The unexpected death of  
 his young gentleman is the cause of very general and sincere  
 regret. He was educated at Oscott college, and early distin-  
 guished himself in the studies of ancient and modern litera-  
 ture, &c. Mild in his disposition, unpretending in manner,  
 firm in moral and religious principle, he won the friend-  
 ship and esteem of all within the circle of his acquaintance.  
 Pious as a son, and loving as a brother, his death must be a  
 source of poignant affliction to his parents. Their deep sorrow  
 at this irreparable domestic bereavement has elicited the uni-  
 versal sympathy of our fellow-citizens. His many amiable and  
 benevolent qualities will long be affectionately remembered by  
 the relatives he has left to mourn over his early tomb. He died  
 a peaceful death of a Christian, relying on the infinite  
 merits of His Blessed Redeemer, and in the hope of a happy  
 and joyful resurrection. The funeral this morning was attended  
 by the Mayor, members of the Corporation and Chamber of  
 Commerce, and an immense cortege of all orders, to the new  
 cemetery of St. Lawrence.
