**ARREST FOR MURDER.**—A man named Patrick  
Cosgrove was conveyed to our County Gaol yester-  
terday on a warrant charging him with the murder  
of a farmer named James M'Grath, near Oola, alleged  
to be committed about a month ago. The prisoner  
was arrested at Liverpool, just as he was landing on  
the quays by Head Constable M'Hale, and was, it is  
said, about to take his departure for America. He  
was brought from Dublin on Thursday night in charge  
of two of the Metropolitan constabulary.

**INQUEST ON THE LATE MRS. KELLY.**—An inquest  
was held on Wednesday on the mutilated remains of  
Mrs. Kelly. After the jury had been sworn by the  
coroner, one witness only was examined. It appears  
that the unfortunate woman ran on the approach of  
the assassins, and fell on her face, when both ruffians  
fired at her head. She died immediately. On ac-  
count of circumstances that transpired on Wednes-  
day, the inquest was adjourned until the 15th inst.  
A professional man who had been in custody has been  
discharged, as there was not the slightest ground of  
suspicion against him. Another individual, a rela-  
tive of Mrs. Kelly, has not yet been discharged, and  
three persons of the peasant class are in custody.

The Cork papers state, that the Coroner's Jury, in  
the case of Mrs. Kelly, has returned a verdict of  
wilful murder against some persons unknown.

The estate of Ballinderry, where the murder took  
place, contains nearly 1500 acres; Mrs. Kelly had  
been engaged in draining and improving it. There  
is little exaggeration as to the extent of the property  
obtained by the deceased under the will of her hus-  
band, Edmond Kelly, Esq. of Rookwood, which had  
been the subject of such protracted litigation in the  
cause of Kelly *v.* Thewles, in the Prerogative Court  
and the Court of Delegates. Besides landed estates  
to the value of between 7,000*l.* to 8,000*l.* a year,  
Mrs. Kelly obtained nearly 250,000*l.* in funded  
property. In a case in which she had been prosecu-  
trix, a few years since, she was stated to have paid  
30,000*l.* for investment in share property, which sum  
eventually she lost. But her chattel property must  
still have been upwards of 200,000*l.* She had lent  
134,000*l.* to the Midland Great Western Railway  
Company, for which she held a mortgage on the  
Royal Canal, the property of that company, for which  
she has been receiving nearly 7,000*l.* per annum.  
Mrs. Kelly, about a year since, made a will, which  
was deposited for safe keeping at the Bank of Meers.
