

Quarter Sessions opened on Wednesday. Robert Tighe, Esq. Assistant-Barrister, and today, the following Grand Jury were sworn:—Flaherty, Esq. Donoman-Castle, foreman; Mason, Wm. John Evans, Frank Fowbery, Hill, John Bouchier, Edward W. Morgan, Russell, Godfrey Massy, John Rodger, Dudley, Gib. Rawley, and Daniel O'Donovan, Esqrs. The following convictions took place:—Thomas larceny of Workhouse clothes, one fortnight's imprisonment; Daniel M'Auliff, do., to be whipped; Clanchy, robbery of silver watches at Rathkeale, same at the house of Mr. O'Donovan, to four years' penal servitude for each; Ellen Divine, larceny at Moylan's hotel, two months' imprisonment; Norry Sheehy, larceny of clothes, the property of James Rourke, four months' penal servitude; Patrick Moran, assault at Rathkeale, twelve months' imprisonment; Daniel and Michael Sullivan, picking pockets at Rathkeale and Stonehall, nine months' imprisonment; Ellen O'Brien, stealing from Mary Fitzgerald, four years' penal servitude; Mary Sheehy, stealing boots at Rathkeale, six months' imprisonment; Jeremiah Nolan stood indicted for the larceny of £80 from J. Ffanagan, Newcastle, the property of the Barrister sent him for trial at the next Assizes.

James W. Bassett of Newport Mills; Messrs. J. W. Carey of Caher Mills, and Mr. Carey of Tipperary, were declared contractors for supplying bread stuffs to the Tipperary union according to lowest price, and given satisfaction previously in the supplies. At the Police Office this morning, James Fitzgerald was committed for a violent assault on his mother, an old woman of 80, was sent to jail for one month, in default of finding bail. James Hayes drunk, fined 1s. or 48 hours. Bridget Hryes was remanded for a day, on a charge of picking pockets in the market.

It may be of importance to many readers of the LIMERICK CHRONICLE to know that in a Bill, now before Parliament, granting an allowance of the extra duty on Malt in the stocks of Maltsters, Malt Roasters, and Malt, Licensee-Brewers, and Vinegar Dealers, when the present War Duty ceases on the 1st of July next, it is provided, that in order to obtain the allowance the Malt must be dry and unground, and every claimant must give notice in writing to the Officer of Excise, two days previously to the 1st of July next, of his name, residence, and business, and the place in which the Malt shall be stored, and whether the Malt is screened or un-screened, or Pale or Brown; and also, before the 3rd of July next, to place his Malt in such form that it may be conveniently gauged. The claim for allowance will be forfeited if any account of shall be removed before the 6th of July next, and penalties are imposed if grain is mixed with the Malt, or any contrivance resorted to to deceive the Excise as to quantity.

DEATH OF REV. DR. TOWNLEY.

It is with feelings of deep regret we this day record the death of the Rev. Dr. C. G. Townley, which melancholy event took place on Tuesday last, 17th inst., at his residence in London, after a few days illness. The demise of this much lamented clergyman, whose labours in the cause of religion will long be remembered, has aroused the deepest sympathy towards his sorrowing family and friends, of the latter of whom, there is a great number in this city, in which he spent a quarter of a century, and the third part of his long and useful life in his Heavenly Master's service. He regarded not the suite or disapprobation of man when the truth was in question. His talents were consecrated to the LORD and the diffusion of the Gospel. He translated nearly all the new testament into Irish, and published many valuable works in prose and verse, especially suited to the young. With a single eye he served his Lord and master, placing his sole reliance on the blood of CHRIST, through which he received acceptance before GOD, and obtained grace to overcome the world.

This afternoon, Patrick Ryan, a slater, fell from the roof of a house in Upper Henry-street, and received such severe injuries, that his life is despaired of.
