On last evening, at his seat, Edwardstown, in this county,
John Russell, Esq. JP. The death of this much respected
gentleman is not only a source of deep affliction to his family,
but is greatly regretted by a very large circle of friends and
acquaintances. Mr. Russell had been one of the most enter-
prising merchants and best employers in our city. He came
over to this country from England in the year 1821, and em-
barked very extensively in the provision trade, which he car-
ried on most prosperously, and in the year 1851 he retired
from the business, in which he has been since succeeded by
his son-in-law, Mr. William G. Gubbins. Mr. Russell was the
founder of the Limerick Shipping Company, which has since
been superseded by the London and Limerick Steam Com-
pany, of which he was the local chairman. In every relation
of life the deceased gentleman well merited the respect and
esteem in which he was held by all classes of his fellow citi-
zens. The funeral will take place at 10 o'clock on Friday
morning.
