By the circular just addressed by the Archbishop of Vienna to the clergy of his diocese we learn :- 1. That the Archbishop is empowered by the Pope to remove by "dispensation" the prohibition of marriage between Catholic and non-Catholic Christians. 2. That the dispensation will only be granted when it appears certain that all the issue of a mixed marriage will be educated in the Catholic religion. 3. If the bridegroom, being a non-catholie, promises to have all his children brought up in the Catholic faith, the priest will perform the marriage ceremony, but if he refuse to give such promise, and his affianced bride persists in her resolution to enter into a matrimonial engagement with him, then the Papal Brief of May 22 1841, comes in force, and "the parish priest shall receive the declaration of their resolve to marry in the presence of two witnesses, but shall carefully avoid giving to the act the appearance of an ecclesiastical ceremony."
