D. Bourke, of Rutland-street, and William-street, leaving a
wife and young family to deplore their irreparable loss. En-
deared to them by the strongest of human ties, enhanced by
the possession of these many virtues which mark the true
Christian and the honest man, few but will accord their sym-
pathy to this mourning family under their sad bereavement.
As a man of business Mr. Bourke was upright in his dealings,
persevering in the path of honorable industry—ever assiduous
and attentive, he conciliated the good opinion of all. He
was a pious and devoted Catholic. In 1850 he became member
of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul—was its treasurer, and
always took an active part in its proceedings, and a sincere in-
terest in its success. The roofless garret and the damp cellar
of the poor and unhappy were not unknown to him; unas-
suming and unnoticed did he wish to do the good work, and
the hand of charity and the words of hope and consolation
were ever at the sufferer's call. His remains were conveyed
on Tuesday morning to their last resting place, at the new
cemetery, attended by a most respectable funeral procession.
