**EXPORTATION OF POTATOES.**—This day a crowd of  
...persons collected upon Honan's-quay, where the ship  
...*Mary Young*, of Dublin, (Warde, master), was being  
...loaded with potatoes, purchased in the Limerick  
...Market for exportation to the latter port. The con-  
...duct of a drunken sailor, who was on board, subse-  
...quently originated a disturbance, he having called  
...upon the people to prevent the exportation of that  
...commodity, which is the chief food of the poorer  
...classes. The sailor came ashore, and ascending a car,  
...which was in the act of being unloaded, compelled the  
...driver to return with the potatoes to the Market,  
...followed by a mob, shouting in exultation at the  
...victory achieved. The Mayor was promptly on the  
...spot to institute inquiries, and had the Police ordered  
...out to protect the ship from plunder. Sub-Inspector
