Gabbett, Esq. Bellfield, North Strand.

lady lived to a good age, and a more valuable, sincere, and
disinterested lady seldom existed. Her demise is sincerely
and deservedly regretted.

This morning, at 41, Thomas-street, Eliza M. O'Brien, the
beloved wife of the late John O'Brien, Esq. h p 16th Regt. of
Foot, and Royal County Limerick Regiment.

On Monday, at his residence, Newcastle West, the Very
Rev Dean Coll, PP—a clergyman not more remarkable for
the brilliancy of his talents than for the amiability of his
manner and the charitableness of his disposition. Few clergy-
men in the diocese could equal this learned dignitary in
oratorical power; none could surpass him in zeal for the
glory of God and the advancement of religion—he was an
ornament to the faith which he professed. The memory of
his good deeds will long survive him in Newcastle, where is
established a Convent of Mercy, at a cost to himself of over
£1,060.

October 13, at Rathory, Ardee, John Coleman, Esq. at the
advanced age of 91 years, much regretted. His remains were
interred on Thursday last in the family burial ground, Louth.
His funeral was one of the largest and most respectable seen
for many years in the county of Louth, having been attended
by the respectability and gentry for miles around. A gentle-

home in the person of John Coleman, crowned by patriarchal
years, and escorted by the heartfelt prayers of a whole
district.
