On Christmas eve, at her house, Sydney-avenue, Blackrock, aged 79 years Deborah Charlotte Willis, relict of the late Rev. Thomas Gilbert Willis, LL.D. Rector of Kilmurry and Derrygalvin. Her remains were interred on yesterday in the family burial ground at St. Mary's Cathedral, having been borne to the grave by her sons—the Revds. Thomas, William, Henry, Newcombe, and John Willis, and Doctor Willis, Co Dublin Light Infantry. Deceased was last surviving grand-daughter of Davide Duha, Vicomte de Laval, one of the founders of and first settlers in Portarlington, Queen's County. The coffin was borne into the nave of the cathedral by her six sons, and surely, it is the noblest monument woman can have and the highest testimony of individual worth, to leave such representatives—five of the clergymen of the Church of England.—The service was read by the Dean of Limerick.
