DEATHS.

This morning at No. 8, Lower Mallow-street, aged 66 years. after a long and painful illness. borne with a christian resignation and hope. Bridget, eldest daughter of the late Richard Harte, Esq. formerly of Doon House, co. Clare, and of Gortroe, in this county.

Of yellow fever at Lisbon, in his 46th year. Major David Berkeley Cotter, P. S. K. T. S., fourth son of the late Edward Cotter, Esq. of Bandon. This gallant officer, lost a leg at Oporto, during the memorable siege action of 23d July, 1833. on which day the siege was raised and the Miguelite army, of 30,000 men, retreated to Lisbon. Major Cotter was always a favorite with the Royal Family of Portugal, and, the popular young King ordered a funeral at his own expense on a grand scale.

Also, at Lisbon of yellow fever, John, aged 14 years, and Ferdinand, aged 16 years, sons of the late Major Cotter. They survived their father only a few days.

At Lisbon, the illustrious senior, Judge Gentil brother-in-law of the late Major Cotter who only survived him six days.
