At Cork Police Court, Mary Williams was fined £100 for having 23lb. of smuggled tobacco in her possession.

On Friday morning a man named Manty, who lived near Ashford, dropped dead; a few moments before he was apparently in good health.

A memorial has been forwarded to the trustees of the Devon property and to Lord Courtnay, requesting a site for a school at Hospital under the Christian Brothers.

A farmer named Patrick Frawley, who lived within two miles of Newcastle, was found dead on the road near that town on Friday.

Mr. Scott, of the Cork Corporation, has given notice that every third year a Conservative member of that body shall be elected to the office of Mayor.

Mr. Hartley, (a native of Cork), of the firm of James Hartley and Co., London, has recovered an accession to his property of £2,000 a year and £30,000.

J. W. Lynch, Esq, has been sworn in High Sheriff of Galway, and Joseph M'Donnell, Esq, Sub.

£62 a year has been awarded by the Cork Corporation to Messrs. Gibbingi and Bernard, for loss of office in connexion with the Court of Conscience.

Mr. John Fitzmaurice, of Oranmore, County Clare, died suddenly on Sunday.

Mr. Maurice Mahony, of Tralee is appointed Master Extraordinary in Chancery for that town, and Mr. Henry O'Connor, for the County of Cerk.
