A circular has been issued by the Horse Guards containing regulations in regard to the promotion of officers preparatory to promotion in the Army, to be substituted for those provided in the circulars of May, 1850, and July,

A circular, respecting religious instruction in Army schools, has been issued from the Secretary of State of War having decided in favour of the terms of Article 38 of the Army Regulations of July, 1857 so as to separate the general attendance, and to remove any doubt which may exist as to the equality and freedom of members of the Army in respect to the former, by Major-General Peel, to forward to the Secretary of State a regulation which is to be substituted in question. I am to take this opportunity of adding that Major-General Peel is of opinion that it will tend to promote to the general instruction of Army schools if in every regiment and there is no local assistant inspector it is the duty of some one officer, besides the commanding officer, if possible, one who will voluntarily visit them periodically during the absence of the commanding officer, and to call the attention of the commanding officer to all circumstances which he may think which may be pointed out to him by the commanding officer as susceptible of improvement. If any defect which cannot be remedied by the commanding officer, the reports furnish him with the opportunity of remedying it.
