His humility, charity, and affability of manner endeared him to all. Totally exempt from political and sectorian acerbity, in him were blended the true Christian and courteous gentleman. Long and well prepared to meet his Maker, after a life of energy and prosperity. his end was happiness and peace. With truth can it be said-" He was "the noblest work of God-an honest man." Mr. O'Hara was a member of a highly respectable and ancient family in the county Antrim, and settled in Limerick more than half a century ago.
