DEATHS.

Died, at his summer residence, Whiting Bay, near Ardmore, county Waterford, to which place he had gone but a few days previously, Sir Richard Musgrave, third baronet. The deceased baronet was born on the 6th January, 1790, and was married to Frances, daughter of his Grace, William Newcome, Archbishop of Armagh. He succeeded his father, Sir Richard, in the baronetcy, in 1826. Richard Musgrave, Esq, uncle to the deceased, was created first baronet on the 2nd of December, 1732. He was a member of the Irish Parliament, and known as a political writer, particularly by his history of the Irish rebellion of 1798. On his death, in 1818 the title devolved on his brother, Sir Christopher Musgrave. The death of Sir Richard Musgrave, third baronet, was quite unexpected. He is succeeded in the title and estates by his eldest son, Richard Musgrave, Esq.
