On Monday evening the annual missionary meeting of the Primitive Wesleyan Methodist Missionary Society was held in Belfast. The chair was occupied by the Mayor, Wm Ewart, jun. Esq. Three addresses have been transmitted from the diocese of Ferns, to be presented to the Holy Father,—one from the town of Wexford and vicinity, a second from the president, professors and students, of St. Peter's College, and a third from the bishop, clergy, and faithful of the diocese at large, and signed by upwards of 26,000 persons.

A Paris correspondent denies the statement that the Emperor of the French has suppressed the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, and says there is no truth in the report circulated to that effect.
