DEATHS.

At Laurel-hill Cottage, Victoria-terrace, on yesterday (Friday, 17th instant), at 9 o'clock, p.m., Mrs Frances O'Farrell, at the advanced age of 80. She remembered the swamp over which her uncle, James O'Sullivan, at immense outlay and unprofitable expenditure, opened the entrance to Limerick on the Dublin road, from Park-hill to Baal's-bridge, and on which he built the once fashionable but now neglected range of houses in Clare-street. Her brother, the late Henry O'Sullivan, of George-street, was long known in the city for commercial integrity, sincerity of friendship and unostentations benevolence. Her son, the Rev Henry O'Farrell, is beloved by the poor, and respected by every class of citizens. He spent nine years in Italy studying for the ecclesiastical state, and since he returned in 1842, devoted great zeal and untiring exertions in alleviating the distress of the famine years, and advocating every social and moral virtue. The deceased led a retired and virtuous life, retained her faculties to the last moment, and died without pain or agony. Her remains will be conveyed to the family vault at Parteen, on Monday morning, at ten o'clock.
