Constable Brown, of the Cabirdavin Police Station, and Head Constable Frawley, of William-street Station, brought before the Magistrates on yesterday, the dead body of a male child, aged seven weeks, named Gerald Molony, which was found in the ruins of a house in the North Liberties. The mother of the deceased was taken into custody, and an inquest held on the body same day before Thomas Costello, Esq., one of the coroners, when, although the mother was fixed with the unnatural act of depositing the dead body in the ruins, yet no foul play being discoverable on the corpse, the Jury, under the direction of the Coroner, discharged the prisoner; but, on subsequent examination of the body, a square stone was found fixed in the throat, and which must have been manipulated into the position, in which it was discovered. This stone is supposed to have been taken out of a wall as pieces of mortar which had adhered to it were found lower down in the throat. The mother has been re-arrested, and an inquiry will be held to-morrow before the Justices.

The Smack Jane, of this port, belonging to Messrs. Russell, was struck by lightning in Dingle, a few evenings since, and suffered material injury. The electric fluid in its course unloosed five fathoms of chain, knocked away five feet of bulwark, ran along the jibhalyards and through the forecastle. It then passed down the mast, shattered a piece of solid oak, six inches square, that came in its way, and finally perforated the deck.

The monthly fair of Newcastle (West.) held on Monday, was very large and well attended by buyers and sellers; several lots of in-calf heifers were sold and brought high prices; dry heifers were in improved demand, and calves appear to be going up fast; working horses were in good request, and a great many exchanged owners. Mr O'Donnell obtained 25l. for a nice grey mare; bacon pigs sold well; the Messrs. Daly, of Charleville, bought largely; store pigs went very high, and mutton 7d to 8d. per lb.; cabbage plants sold at the unprecedented price of 2s. 6d. per hundred.
