Elizabeth Gough, the nursemaid, has been arrested at Frome for the mysterious and barbarous murder of the little boy, Francis Kent, the details of which atrocious deed have already been published.

The annual North East Agricultural show at Belfast, on Thursday was numerously supplied, and there was a large attendance of visitors.

At Clifden, Co. Galway Petty Sessions the Magistrates investigated a case of assault at the suit of the Rev George Shea, Incumbent, v. the Rev Patrick Romaine, R.C.O., arising out of a religious affray in connexion with attendance on a dying man. The Bench pronounced both parties in fault, and dismissed the case.

A woman named O'Brien died this week at Shannongrove, near Pallaskenry, at the advanced age of 106 years.

The Guardians of the South Dublin Union have resolved to resist the Rev Mr. Fox, R.C., Chaplain of the workhouse, in resuming his duties contrary to the orders of the Poor Law Commissioners.

Marcus Hedderman has been left for execution at Ennis for the murder of Patrick Mahony at Kiltrush, but no day is fixed, points having been reserved for argument in the upper Courts.

The Grand Jury of Wicklow have passed a resolution for an alteration in the law so as to enable them to appoint a special officer for applotting County Cess.

At the Central Criminal Court, London, a lady named Feltham has been convicted of a robbery at a fancy fair which was held in the early part of last month at the Crystal Palace, and sentenced to six months imprisonment in Newgate.

A frightful attempt at suicide, and which had nearly proved instantaneously fatal, was made on yesterday in the city gaol by a prisoner named William Moore, a private of the 2nd battalion of the 9th Regiment of Foot, now stationed in this garrison, and who had been handed over to the civil authorities, for a desperate attempt on the life of a corporal of the same regiment, under the circumstances reported in last CHRONICLE. The prisoner was in the day room in company with two others and a turnkey, and was in the act of shaving himself, when on a sudden he inflicted a fearful gash on his throat, slitting his windpipe down from the chin to the breast bone. Happily, the assizes being proceeding, and several medical gentlemen being in attendance about the county court house, which almost adjoins the gaol, aid was at hand. Doctors Gelston, Gore, and Burke were promptly on the scene and rescued the unhappy man from immediate dissolution by stitching up the wound and performing those other services which medical aid dictated. There are, however, but slight hopes of recovery.
