On Monday, November 18th, 1861, a public meeting, convened by the Right Worshipful J. T. MacSheehy, Mayor, was held in the Town Hall, Rutland street, to make arrangements to carry into effect the project set on foot by the Fuel Committee of last year—of receiving public subscriptions to purchase Fuel for distribution amongst the Poor of the City during the present inclement season, and to provide against the severe weather which generally ushers in the new year. The Chair was occupied by the Mayor, when the following resolutions were proposed and carried:—

FUEL FUND—THE POOR.

Resolved—That Dr. O'Shaughnessy, H. N. Seymour and James Barry, Esqrs. be requested to act as Secretaries to the Fuel Fund Committee for the current year.

Resolved—That the gentlemen who kindly acted as collectors to the Fuel Fund last year be requested to co-operate in the same good work this year, and that the collections be forthwith commenced in the different wards of the city.

Resolved—That the clergymen of all denominations be called on to co-operate in aid of the collections in the different parishes.

Proposed by Dr. Griffin; seconded by Captain Gavin:
Resolved—That the resolutions be published in the local papers.

Resolved—That a subscription list be opened forthwith to carry out the objects of the meeting.
Proposed by the High Sheriff:

Resolved that the Mayor vacate the chair, and the Bishop be moved thereon.
