

served in Canada and the West Indies. Colonel Cole, 17th Regiment, and Lieutenant Gilby, 32nd, have retired from the Army upon half-pay; the retirement from the service of Captain Montessor, Grenadier Guards, Captain Newall, 8th Foot, Lieut. Manners, 10th, Captain Mackey, 17th, and Captain Davidson, 1st West India Regt. is also announced.

It is reported at Chatham garrison that a considerable reduction in the army will be made at the end of financial year, and the army estimates to be presented to Parliament are being prepared in accordance with the intention.

Two 24 pounder guns have been mounted at Elizabeth Fort Cork, where the depot of the Royal Cork Artillery is stationed, for the purpose of enabling the men of that regiment to practice the great gun exercise without the necessity of their going to the Barracks for it as heretofore.

The strength of the garrison at the camp at Colchester at the commencement of the present month was 62 officers, 12 staff sergeants, and 2,316 non-commissioned officers and privates.

CANTON PRIZE MONEY—Notice is in the *Gazette*, that preparations are now being made for the intended distribution of the sum of 30,543l. 15s awarded by the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury on the 24th November 1860, being the value of prizes captured between the 28th and 30th of December 1857, which has been allotted to the officers and men who were engaged in the operations at Canton within that period, excluding the marines serving with the army.
