On Wednesday night, at his father's residence, George-street, after a brief illness, Thomas, youngest son of Edward Cruise, Esq., proprietor of the Royal Hotel. Called away in the prime of life, at the early age of 27 years, the sad bereavement, which was quite unexpected, has plunged the family and friends of this highly intelligent and much esteemed young gentleman into the deepest grief. Possessed of all the refined qualities which adorn the mind, he was kind-hearted, cheerful, and at all times agreeable, equally so to the humblest as to the highest personage, a treat which entitled him to public respect and esteem. We have not known many whose death is more universally regretted by all classes of citizens, nor one whose unblemished character, and endearing manners, have been so highly spoken of. Deeply do we sympathise with his sorrowing family at the loss of so worthy and excellent an individual. The mournful display made throughout the city testified the high respect felt for the family of the deceased. This morning the remains of the lamented young gentleman were interred in the family vault, St. John's Church, followed to the grave-yard by a large concourse of respectable citizens, and a number of private equipages.
