Duplicate plans and sections describing situation, and levels of the proposed Rail works, and the lands, houses, and other property through which they will be made, and which are required for the purposes thereof, together with a Book of Reference to such plans, containing names of the owners and lessees, or reputed owners, and of the occupiers of such lands and other property; also a published map showing the line of Railway delineated thereon, so as to show the general course and direction, and a copy of the Notice, will, on or before the 30th day of November instant, be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Kerry, at his office, at the County House, Tralee, and with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Limerick, at his Office at the County House, in the City of Limerick, and on or before the same day a copy of so much of the said plans and Book of Reference as relates to the parishes in or through which the intended Railway will be made, or in which any lands, houses, or other property are intended to be taken, and a copy of the Notice will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Union in which each such parish or townland is included; that is to say, as relates to the parishes and townlands comprised within the Union of Tralee with the Clerk of that Union at his office at the Workhouse near Tralee; as also the several parishes and townlands comprised within the Union of Listowel, with the Clerk of that Union at his office at the Workhouse, near Listowel; and the several parishes and townlands comprised within the Union of Glin, with the Clerk of that Union at his office at the Workhouse, near Glin. Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 23rd December next.
