TAX.—The New Income Tax From the 5th April, for one year—7d. on £100, and 9d. on an abatement is, however, to be less than £200 a year. "Any person assessed or charged to any of the duties by this act, or who shall be entitled to a deduction or otherwise, and who shall have done in the manner prescribed by law, his total income from every source amounting to £100 or upwards, in any year of assessment of his profits shall be relieved from so much of the duties assessed upon or paid either by him or by any other person in discharge of the said duties upon £60 as shall be necessary to bring the amount to, and such relief shall be given by a deduction or abatement of the duties assessed upon the said person, or by the repayment of the excess as shall have been assessed, in the same manner as
