THE ARCHBISHOP OF DUBLIN.—The remains of the late Archbishop of Dublin have been removed from his country residence to Stephen's Green, from which they will be removed for interment on Thursday next.

Pending the appointment of a successor it is necessary to nominate an Administrator, or Proctors, to conduct the business of the Archbishop, and for this purpose a meeting of the Clergy of Christ Church and St. Patrick's will be held on Thursday next. It is believed that the appointment of an Administrator will most probably fall on the venerable Dr. West, Archdeacon of Dublin, who for some years acted as private secretary to the late Archbishop, is peculiarly qualified to perform the duties of the office, and by whom they were discharged for some time previous to the late Archbishop's decease.

The appointment of a successor to the late Archbishop of Dublin in the gift and patronage of Lord Clonmel; but any church patronage in Ireland held by his lordship, he places at the disposal of the Lord Lieutenant.

The Lord Bishop of Killaloe held his annual visitation of the clergy of the diocese at the cathedral, on Thursday last.

A memorial, most influentially and generally signed by the Protestant parishioners of Malahide, has been presented through the churchwardens, to the Hon. and Rev. the Dean of St. Patrick's, praying that the Dean and Chapter may be pleased to continue the faithful and active ministrations of the Rev.
