Kilkee, July 27, 1864.

Night after night those brutes get into the yard of the house my family reside in, any when there, cannot get out, the result being the annoyance and disturbance of every one in the locality. Surely the Constabulary should bring all such cases before petty sessions, and get authority to shoot all dogs of the description alluded to found roving about, no one knowing the owners. Dogs going about, without log or muzzle, as here, would not be tolerated in other places, where the Constabulary know, and do their duty.
