**DEATHS.**

It is with regret we announce the death of Dr. Allen, which  
took place on Tuesday evening, at his residence, Shannon-  
street, in this city, in his 75th year. He was a man who,  
during a long course of practice, possessed the faculty of  
gaining a numerous circle of friends, but not one enemy. To  
his profession he was an ornament, while in private life he  
was endeared to all who knew him as a friend and a neigh-  
bour, and his loss is greatly deplored, not alone by his family,  
but by those who knew and esteemed him for the various  
good qualities which he possessed; while to the poor his loss  
will be irreparable, for he not only visited them when asked  
at all hours, free of charge, but gave them medicine gratul-  
tously when they could not afford to pay for it. Dr. Allen  
held for a few years the office of Assistant-Surgeon in the  
Navy, which he resigned. He was offered a commission as a  
recompence for his services while so employed, but he refused  
to accept the proffered honour. His interment will take  
place to-morrow morning at 9½ o'clock, in the new cemetery.
