**MISSIONS**—The board of missions of the Presbyterian Church met in Belfast on the 8th inst. Among the members present were—the Moderator, and the Revs. Dr. Cooke, Dr. Morgan, Dr. Wilson, Wm. M. Murray, &c. The Convener of the Foreign Mission stated, that owing to declining health, the result of a lengthened service in India, the Rev. J. M'Kee under the necessity of leaving the mission field, and that the Rev. Robert Montgomery is about to return for a short period to this country. He proposed that another missionary be appointed in addition to Mr. Beattie appointed at last meeting and now studying Gierati and other languages under Dr. Glasgow. Mr. Wm.
