

DUBLIN CATTLE MARKET.
 The supply of fat cattle is short. The butchers have had an exceedingly good sale for meat this Christmas, so they were again in want of a supply.— Trade brisk. Large finished oxen and heifers made 8s to 80s per 112lbs; 2nd class, 72s to 75s; fat cows and half-finished steers, 60s to 70s; wether mutton, d to 8½d per lb; ewes, 7½d.

DUBLIN CORN MARKET.

To-day's market was somewhat of a holiday character. All descriptions of grain met with a steady demand at former quotations.

DUBLIN CATTLE MARKET.

As usual, first market after Christmas was small; beasts 990; sheep 2,018; veal calves 21; store cattle not ascertained, the dealers having removed to Old Smithfield with that class. Prime beef met an exceedingly ready sale at 70s per cwt, and, in some cases, a shade over it. Mutton was easier to sell at 7d to 7½d per lb. Veal scarce, and worth 9d for good quality. High prices of beef are anticipated from the deficiency in green droppings, and high price of grain, prohibiting, in a great measure, its use in stall feeding. Mutton, although more plenty at present, must partake of the rise if it comes.

Wool is in steady request, and of late some sales have been made advantageously, but not up to the maximum prices of the past season.
