AUSTRIA.

VIENNA, FEB. 5TH.—It is stated that at the meeting of the shareholders of the Credit Anstalt, to be held this evening, a resolution will be introduced for the appointment of a committee to consider whether any modification of the statutes or reorganisation of the direction of the Credit Anstalt is necessary. The committee would consist of seven shareholders, to be elected at an extraordinary general meeting, two members of the council of management, and the chairman of the board of directors. The number of shareholders on the committee could, if necessary, be subsequently increased. Should the committee decide in favour of any modifications, they would proceed to draw up the necessary proposals, and would submit them to the shareholders at the next ordinary meeting.

VIENNA, FEB. 5.—It is stated that at the Cabinet Council recently held at Buda, the matters discussed did not refer to Hungary, but to Prussia and Mexico. The Diet of Lower Austria will be closed on the 15th instant.
