The luggage of a commercial traveller named
 Frewen was searched in the shop of Mr. O'Leary,
 Tipperary, on Thursday, by Sub Inspector Saville and
 a party of police, but nothing was found with him.
 The barbarous system of plucking wool off sheep at
 night was carried to a great extent in the neighbour-
 hood of Ballisalee, without any clue being obtained
 of the offenders. On Monday night, from informa-
 tion which he received, Head Constable Ellis, with a
 party of men proceeded to the farm of Mr. Harrison,
 on the estate of Colonel Maberly, and succeeded in
 capturing two persons who, with a third, drove a flock
 of sheep into a corner of the field where the police
 were concealed, and after tying their fore feet together,
 commenced denuding them of their wool. The per-
 sons caught were John M'Caue and his wife.
 M'Caue is a private in the King's County Militia.
