The trial of three of the prisoners charged with assaulting the police at Manchester concluded yesterday. The prisoners were convicted. The jury also found that a warrant had been made out against Kelly and Deasey on the day of the rescue, and that it was in the form that had been sworn to. Sentence was deferred. Another batch of the men charged with complicity in the attack were then put forward. They pleaded "Not guilty." The court then adjourned until this morning.

The *Moniteur* says the Maximian demonstrations at Milan and Pavia were not responded to by the people in the revolutionary manner described by a French journal, order having been re-established in both immediately after the outbreak. Arrests, however, have taken place. Florence and most of the cities of Italy are tranquil.
