Count Bismarck has suppressed an influential newspaper in Frankfort-on-the-Maine, for having commented unfavourably on the conduct of Prussia towards the Danes of Schleswig. A lively sympathy is springing up in France for this oppressed people, and it is surmised that its growth does not augur pacific relations between Prussia and France.

James Prowse, a clerk who had absconded in May last from his employers, Messrs. Hoddwood, Fletcher, and Co., merchants at Cape Town, Cape of Good Hope, was brought before the Lord Mayor, charged with stealing various sums of money belonging to his employers, amounting to £7,500. A reward of £300 had been offered for the prisoner's apprehension, and he was apprehended on Thursday at Cornwall. The prisoner was remanded.
