ENNIS PETTY SESSIONS.

On this day the usual weekly court was held. The magistrates present were—Edmund Blake, R.M.; Thomas Greene, P. Maxwell Cullinan, M.D., and Michael Kerin, Esqrs.

COW-STEALING.

A person who gave his name as John Magee, from the county Mayo, charged with stealing a cow, the property of a dealer in stock, named Rafferty, from the county Roscommon, was brought up, having been arrested in Clarin-bridge, county Galway, by Constable M. Dowling, where the cow had also been seized, on a communication having been received by the constable from Head-Constable Mills, of Ennis. The beast had been stolen from the Easter Fair on the 15th ult.

Mr. Blake denounced in strong language the practice of bowling on the public roads, and on the prosecution of Sub-Constables Hayes and Dowling, fined a man named Frawley 2s 6d and costs.

The court then adjourned.

The compensation for which George Carson applied, to the amount of £10, for a boat which was stated to be maliciously destroyed on 27th November last, was reduced to £8.

The presentment of Mrs. Jane Stacpoole and Richd. Stacpoole, J.P., for malicious burning of a dwelling-house, was granted at £45.

The presentment of Wainright Crowe, J.P., for malicious injury of a boat belonging to him, stated to be value for £5, was granted without dissent.

After the disposal of the usual routine business, the court adjourned.
