The Dutch screw frigate Adolph Hetz Von Nassau, 51 guns, Captain De Mann, arrived and anchored at Spithead on Saturday, from Toulon, bound for Texel, short of coals. On arriving she exchanged the usual salutes with the flagship of Sir Thomas Pasley, the Victory, in Portsmouth harbour. Capt. De Mann and his officers were during the day introduced officially to Admiral Sir Thomas Pasley, and Lieut-General Sir George Buller, the naval and military Commanders-in-Chief, by Chevalier Vandenberg, the Dutch Consul at Portsmouth.

Rear Admiral Thomas Harvey died on Wednesday in his 58th year. He was son of the late Vice Admiral Sir Thomas Harvey, K.C.B., and entered the navy in 1822. After studying at the Royal Naval College he joined as midshipman the Dryad, under Captain the Hon. Robert Rodney. He served under Admiral Sir Charles Napier during the Russian war, and subsequently served in the Pacific where he was Commodore, having been appointed in 1863. He was in receipt of a good service pension for his services at that time he obtained his flag rank. He obtained his post rank January 31, 1848, and was made a Rear Admiral on the active list December 2, 1866.
