Paris, Wednesday. The official journal publishes the following promotions: - Marshal Bezaine to be Commander of the Imperial Guards, General de Failly to the command of the 8rd Army Corps, the head quarters of which are at Nancy; General Sechruitze to the command of the military sub-division in the department of the Haute Garronne, and General Bourbaki to act as resident of consulting committee on the regimental organization of the infantry. The official joarnal says the rumours respecting ministerial changes have never had any foundation. The ministers are at the present time assembled at Competing, preparing measures to be held before the Legislative Body. In reference to these rumours several journals publishing inaccurate statements. The sident of the Senate and the President of the Legislative Body have been summoned to Compeigne with a view to participate in the deliberations on perial decree which is to establish constitutional intercourse between the Government and the great bodies The Council of State have already of the state, taken into consideration the definition of the official functions compatible with those of a deputy; also regulations for the election of the electoral beureau and the general councils for arondissements, and of the municipal councils for the suburban commercial districts of Paris, the election of the municipal council at Lyons, and lastly, the Senatus Consultum regulating the action of similar hodies in the colonies have also formed subjects of deliberation with the Council of State. The Rappel, the Reformer, and the Revel of this evening publish articles attacking the manifesto of the left. The Patrie says that the measure mentioned in this morning's official journals are not the only one which engage the attention of the Government According to the Liberte M. Raspael adheres to his resolution to go to the hall of the Legislative Body on the 26th inst.

The France says that an important Council was held yesterday morning, under the presidency of the Emperor, at which all the political personness now at Compiegne were present. It is asserted that the question of the convocation of the Legislative Body was again discussed. M. Schneider earnestly supported the speedy assembly of the Chambers. The rumour that M. Drouyn de Lhuys has been summoned to Compiegne is devoid of foundation.

### FRANCE.

After the sitting sever-I members of the Cabinet left for Paris, but will return to Complegne to attend another Council, which will be held to-day.

Advices received from the Senegal settlement state that a military post on the frontier of Gayor, was threatened by the native chief, Laddior.

A convoy has been sent from St Louis to the above

locality to provision the garrison and to put the place in a complete state of defence.

The troops serving as an escort to the convoy have already had two engagements with several bands of fanatics who are Laddior's followers.

The Rappel publishes an article, signed by Felix Pyat, urging that no manifestations should take place on the 30th inst, and advising the people to wait a more favourable oppor unity.
