Her Majesty's ship Himalaya is reported to have left Alexandria on the afternoon of the 4th inst. ; the troops brought from Bombay to Suez in her Indian troopship Jumna ; all well. She left Bombay for Suez on the morning of the 5th inst.

The new naval retirement scheme has been generally accepted with great satisfaction. As a matter of course, there are a few exceptions, especially among those officers who have retired from further active service within the last 18 months.

In consequence of the disturbances which have occurred among the men of the Military Arsenal at Woolwich their places as drivers in the Royal Horse Artillery, who receive for their duties working pay, in addition to their pay.

The London Gazette contains notification of several flag promotions consequent on the death of Admiral Sir H J Leake. On the Active List, Rear Admiral B W Walker, Bart, KCB, is promoted to be Admiral ; Rear Admiral A Lowe is promoted to be Admiral ; and Captain R Cumming, CE is promoted to be Admiral. On the Reserved List, Vice Admiral Stanley becomes Admiral ; and Rear Admiral Bowen, Vice Admiral. On the Retired List, Admiral Sir W Ramsay, KCB, becomes Admiral.

In the examination before the Select Committee on Diplomatic and Consular Services, yesterday, Mr. Hammond, permanent secretary to the Foreign Office, said that comparatively little change had taken place in the manner in which our diplomatic service was carried out since the commission was reported that they thought that the service was underpaid, and was against the employment of clerks on account of the delicate character of the work. At present it was of no consequence to a gentleman to put his son into the diplomatic service unless he could afford to give him a private education. His examination had not concluded when the committee rose.

A special telegram from New York has been received proposing that the Secretary of the Treasury should be instructed to issue all the surplus gold, but it was not carried. The prevailing opinion is that the gold will not fall below 110.
