The gentleman cadets have resumed their studies at the Royal Military Academy, Woolwich. The 36 recently appointed cadets will join the Academy on Thursday next, and form the fifth class.

At the Moorsfort Police Station, some three miles from the town of Tipperary, the entire of the constabulary stationed there, numbering six men in all, have, with the exception of the constable, been dismissed since Saturday last, in consequence of the disappearance of about thirty rounds of ammunition from the powder store, which could not be accounted for in any way by the men in charge. On a rigorous search being instituted, twenty rounds of the missing powder were found secreted in the privy, but as the discovery could in no way throw any light on the somewhat mysterious occurrence, a private investigation before Sub-Inspectors Greer, Clonmel; Maher, Bantha; and Blake, Tipperary, was held, which resulted, as already stated, in the dismissal of the entire force, with the exception of the sergeant, from the station.
