A general meeting of subscribers to the French Peasant Farmers' Seed Fund was held on Wednes-day at the Salisbury Hotel, London, Lord Vernon in the chair. The report showed that upwards of £51,000 had been received, and of this sum about £1,000 remains, which the Executive Committee was authorised to distribute among the necessitous peasant farmers.

The jury returned a verdict of "Suicide while in a state of temporary insanity." Much regret is felt for deceased by the officers and men of his regiment.
