The Roman correspondent of the *Tablet* states that the Pope is making exertions to preserve at least a portion of the population of Rome from the influence of the system of education introduced by the Italian authorities. With this object he has established a new University, in which chairs of law, mathematics, medicine, philology, &c. will be filled by the professors who refused to take the oath of allegiance to the Italian government, and new primary schools, under the control of the religious orders, have been opened in various parts of the city.

A general meeting of subscribers to the French Peasant Farmers' Seed Fund was held on Wednesday at the Salisbury Hotel, London, Lord Vernon in the chair. The report showed that upwards of £51,000 had been received, and of this sum about £1,000 remains, which the Executive Committee was authorised to distribute among the necessitous peasant farmers.

An inquest was held on Tuesday, on the body of Colour-Sergeant Phillips, who shot himself on Sunday. It appeared from the evidence that the accounts of the deceased had been audited and found satisfactory, and he suffered no financial embarrassment. Lately he imagined he was falling into consumption, and this preyed upon his mind. Surgeon Jeffcott deposed that a ball had entered the base of the skull, the left side of which was broken into several pieces. The cavity of the skull was empty, the brains having been blown out of it. Witness knew deceased for a long time, but was not aware of his suffering from any illness calculated to disturb his mind. He was a well educated and well conducted man. The jury returned a verdict of "Suicide while in a state of temporary insanity." Much regret is felt for deceased by the officers and men of his regiment.

In his speech at Nottingham, on Monday night, the Hon. Aubern Herbert announced his intention of supporting the demand of Ireland for Home Rule. He said he had too great a love of his own liberty to push upon another nation a rule which was distasteful to her. Mr. Herbert's colleague, Mr. Charles Seely, took the opposite view, and declared he would be no party to any proposal which would in any way weaken the ties that bound Ireland to Great Britain. It is a significant fact that the meeting passed a vote of confidence in Mr. Herbert, while a vote of censure upon Mr. Seely was declared carried by the Chairman. The accession of Mr. Herbert to the Home Rule party is most encouraging.
