Stable James O'Shea charged a notorious named John Beaky with threatening him in the discharge of his duty on duty. The prisoner was returned for trial at the next Sessions.

The women accused were ordered to find bail or in default to be imprisoned for six months. No bail being forthcoming, they were committed to the County Jail.

On the police leaving Court with the prisoners, the stable O'Shea was assaulted in a most violent manner by the girl Connors, who kicked and abused him. She was at once arrested, so another sister of Beaky's and a relative Stephen Beaky, for interference with the girl whilst in charge of the prisoners. The Court, after routine business, adjourned.
