**BRISTOL CATTLE MARKET**—(This Day).—The largest and best show of beef ever exhibited at our Christmas market, the quality of which was extraordinary prime. The Devon short-horn and cross-breed classes were well represented. Mr. Hugh Morgan, of Newport, bought some magnificent Devon oxen from Mr. W. R. Bond, of Taunton; also from Mr. H. Reed, of Axbridge, Somersetshire. These were particularly admired. All were sold. The general price of prime beef, £4 to £4 4s, was in many instances obtained; secondary, 75s.
