

He was accompanied by Lord Kenmare's agent and Mr Morgan J. O'Connell. It is stated that although Killarney is the stronghold of Lord Kenmare's influence, a very decided preference was shown for the Home Rule candidate. In well-informed circles the issue of the contest is looked upon as very doubtful. Mr Dease has undoubtedly the preponderance of influence as far as the great territorial magnate and the Roman Catholic clergy are concerned. Such of the landed gentlemen as are connected with Lord Kenmare, including Mr Herbert, Sir J. O'Connell, and Mr M. J. O'Connell, have already pledged themselves to Mr Dease. It is said the O'Donoghue intends to remain neutral.—Although it is well known that the private sympathy of the Roman Catholic bishop goes with Mr Dease, yet it is believed that, in face of some recent manifestations of public opinion in favour of Mr Blennerhassett, he will take no active part in the struggle. In north and west of Kerry, where the great bulk of the constituency lies, Mr Blennerhassett is undoubtedly the popular favourite.
