Applicants for Relief have been visited 5,616 times by the Members of the Society, who carefully investigate the merits and circumstances of each case, and not only have the immediate pangs of destitution been relieved, but many have been maintained by the Conferences during illness or want of employment until able to resume their occupations, and permanent employment has in many cases been procured for those in need of it.

The personal visits to the houses of the poor have been found to exercise most beneficial influence on their moral condition, as well as on their physical wants, and to encourage them to bear up against their privations, and exert themselves for their own support.
