MURDER IN THE COUNTY LIMERICK.

A murderous assault has been committed on Thomas Meehan, a respectable farmer of New Pallas. Whilst at dinner he heard a gang of men outside his house, and, on opening the door, received a blow from a large stone on the frontal bone between the eyes, His recovery was beyond hope. He died last night.

The forty ninth annual meeting of the Patriotic Assurance Company of Ireland was held at the Company's house, College green, yesterday. Mr Richard Welch presided. The report, which was adopted, showed that the profits of the year amounted to £10,125, out of which the directors recommend a dividend of 7½ per cent on the paid up capital. The dividend absorbed £9,250, thus leaving a balance to be added to the reserve fund of £904, making that fund £7,451. The dividend was approved of, and declared payable on and after the 15th instant.

It is believed the parties had no authority from The O'Donoghue for these promises, and that he will repudiate them. He has not come to Tralee today, though expected.
