DUBLIN CATTLE MARKET.—(This Day).—Large supply of stock; fair trade; top-meated beasts at 72s 6d to 80s; other classes of cattle 10s to 20s per head, and lower since last week; sheep, milderage trade; reduction of 2s to 3s per head; same applies to lambs except prime butchers lots, which supported firmer rates.

SALFORD CATTLE MARKET.—(This Day).—There was a large supply of all kinds of stock of average quality; a steady trade done in beasts and lambs, but sheep moved off slowly; about five hundred foreign beasts were shown, and realised from 8d to 9d per lb; best beef, 8½d; other, 8d to 9d; sheep, 8½d to 10½d per lb; lambs, 10d to 11d; calves, 6½d to 8½d.

LIVERPOOL CATTLE MARKET.—(Yesterday).—There were 1,906 beasts and 10,223 sheep and lambs. There was a large attendance and brisk trade, and a good clearance was effected, at advanced rates. Prices—Best beef, 9d to 9½d per lb; second, 8d to 8½d; sheep, 10d to 10½d; lambs, 10½d to 11d.
