**DUBLIN CATTLE MARKET—(This Day).**—The supply of cattle on offer to-day was larger, and the demand not being active there was a downward move in prices to the extent of ten to twenty shillings per head. Sheep also experienced a bad trade in prices in favour of buyers. Some applied to lambs. Prices—Prime beef, 70s to 75s per cwt.; secondary and inferior, 65s to 65s; wether, 8d to 9½d per lb.; ew, 7d to 8½; lambs, 26s to 45s each.

**SALFORD CATTLE MARKET—(This Day).**—There was a smaller supply of stock of all descriptions and of fair average quality, with exception of lambs, which were rather rough. A steady but slow trade was done. About seven hundred foreign beasts were shown, and ranged from 8½d to 9d per lb; best beef, 9d; other, 7½d to 8d; sheep, 8½d to 10½d per lb; lambs, 10½d to 10½d; calves, 6d to 9d.

**LIVERPOOL CATTLE MARKET.—(Yesterday).**—There were 9,200 beasts and 8,010 sheep and lambs. There was a large attendance and brisk trade, and a good clearance was effected, at advanced rates. Prices—Best beef, 9d to 10½d per lb; second, 8d to 8½d; sheep, 10d to 10½d; lambs, ½d to 11d.

**LONDON CORN MARKET.—(Yesterday).**—Wheat and flour we had a better selling market for beef to-day, every description freely making the extreme rates of last Thursday. Supply of sheep larger; trade slow, at a reduction of 2 to 3s. per head. Lambs met a fair trade, at last week's rates.
