ITALY'S CONSENT TO SUBMIT ALL THE TREATY.

London, Saturday.

Several worthy telegrams have been received at the *Mall* stating that Russia has consented that the terms of the clauses of the Treaty with Turkey should be submitted to Congress.

THE VATICAN.

The *Mall Gazette's* Rome telegram states that the difficulties which hitherto impeded the formation of a Council of Ministers, have been overcome. The same authority states that the Pope, notwithstanding the violent opposition which has been made to the proceeding, has ordered all Italian States to legalize their positions leaving them at the discretion of the Government. This step means the acceptance of loss of temporal power.
