**COURT OF APPEAL—FRIDAY.**

Lord Chancellor, Lord Justice Deasy, and Lord Justice Fitzgibbon.)  
 Re the 'Toiler.'

An appeal from a decision of the Revenue Court of Admiralty, sitting for the which he dismissed the plaintiff's petitions. The plaintiffs, Messrs Spaight and owners of the barque Ruby, brought an action against Messrs Tedcastle and Co, Dublin, the Toiler, to recover damages for the Ruby on the Burford Bank, on the 9th 1878. They alleged that the tug was at the rate of 6d per ton on tonnage of a tow that vessel (which was bound with phosphate rock and deals from St Quebec), into Kingstown Harbour, and through negligence on the part of those the Toiler they conducted and towed aground on the Burford Bank, where a total wreck. On the other hand, the Toiler alleged that he obeyed the directions of the pilot. After a protracted hearing the registrar decided that, as it appeared from the evidence that the master of the tug had obeyed the directions of the pilot, he should dismiss the plaintiff's action with costs. From this decision an appeal was taken.

QC, Queen's Advocate, Dr Seeds, QC, Solicitor-General (instructed by Messrs J T and Sons, Queen's Proctors) were for the plaintiffs; and Mr Johnson, QC, and Mr Burke (instructed by Mr James Davies) were for the defendants.
