

list in the American line steamer Ohio for Philadelphia. So far as could be ascertained they numbered nearly twenty, and were bound to the Western districts of the United States. Together with these were some eighteen miners, principally from the mining districts of Durham and Northumberland, seven of them being from the Seghill colliery, while four were formerly connected with the colliery at Seaton Bourne. The men for the most part were young, and their destinations are Pittsburg, Roleston, and Lancaster, Ohio. In one or two cases the emigrants were accompanied by their wives and families. Mr Puleston, M.P., applied for a passage in the steamer Ohio, but there was no room in the vessel for him. Mr Puleston intended visiting the United States for the purpose of ascertaining the condition of agriculture and commercial industries there.

PROSECUTION OF BANK DIRECTORS.

At Bristol to-day the prosecution of the West of England Bank Directors was resumed. Mr E G Clarke, one of the official liquidators, was cross-examined by Mr Day, he said that the Bank's books were admirably kept.
